Wednesday, July 16th – Morning & afternoon, 60 & 90 minute

Workshops or presentations can be 60, 90, or 120 minutes in length. These sessions can be held indoors, outdoors, or a combination of both—outdoors is encouraged! The Barn is located at a community park that offers large grassy outdoor spaces and is about a 10 minute walk down to the beach. For all sessions we encourage working with other educators to collaborate on your presentations, present more than one perspective or offer panel discussions on similar programming. For presentations longer than 60 minutes, we encourage a hands-on, outdoor, or experiential component. Four 120 minute concurrent sessions will be offered on Tuesday afternoon.

Please consider aligning your presentation and materials to the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) for K12 educators or highlight freshwater aspects of your program. Both NGSS, freshwater, as well as field-based presentations will have a special tag on our program schedule to meet the needs of our members.

Poster Session

Monday, July 14th: 7:00pm - 8:30pm

This year's poster session is an engaging way to share research and citizen science projects that have a watershed, marine, ocean science or learning science focus. This evening session will provide an opportunity for conference attendees to learn more about current projects and to talk directly with researchers and citizen scientists during an informal evening reception. If you are selected to present a poster, we will provide additional information regarding the setup and take-down process, approximate size of the posters, and how posters will be mounted and displayed. No A/V equipment will be available during this session.
